Caleb Elfenbein is Associate Professor of History and Religious Studies at Grinnell College, where he also directs the Center for the Humanities. Focusing especially on Muslim communities, he studies how people in different times and places think about, and debate, human welfare in the context of collective life. His work has appeared in the *Journal of the American Academy of Religion, Method and Theory in the Study of Religion, and The Muslim World*, among other venues. He is editor and director of *Mapping Islamophobia*, a website documenting anti-Muslim activity and its effects on the participation of American Muslims in public life, and author of *Fear in Our Hearts: What Islamophobia Tells Us about America* (NYU Press).
